Our program on September 22 was presented by Diana Barden, past Assistant Governor and Past President of Madera Rotary. Diana is a member of the Rotary History and Heritage International Fellowship and Chairman of the Rotarian Fellowship of Quilters and Fiber Artists.

There are currently over 90 Global Networking Groups, which include Rotary Fellowships, approved by Rotary International. To form a Rotary Fellowship, an application must be signed by Rotary District Governors from a minimum of three countries and approved by the Board of Directors of Rotary International. The countries forming the charter RFQFA are Australia, New Zealand, and the United States.

Conceived by honorary Madera Rotarian Phyllis Giersch, the goal for the Rotarian Fellowship of Quilters and Fiber Artists is to share ideas, techniques, articles, service projects, and stories of interest regarding the fiber arts. The fellowship is open to Rotarians, partners or widows of Rotarians, Inner Wheel members, and members of Rotaract who work in this art form or have an appreciation for its beauty, design and history around the globe.

The RFQFA is also an avenue of providing help to those in need, such as: tactile quilts for the blind, warm quilts for children who are in the care of social services because of neglect or abuse, and quilts or fabric toys to comfort children in countries that have experienced war, famine or other disasters. <http://www.rotaryquilts.org/>

AMIGOS DE GUATEMALA ~by Jan Moore - On September 15th Bob and Janice Hatmaker spoke to us about Amigos De Guatemala, a partnership of Rotary Clubs which provide humanitarian service projects in the Quiche district of Guatemala. Amigos de Guatemala does “hands-on” projects each January and supports an educational sponsorship program in Guatemala. They also sponsor grants that contribute to our various projects. In January, 2005, 13 volunteers helped build a two room classroom in the village of Tunaja. They furnished these classrooms and donated school supplies to this school and Jaibalito (where Groveland Rotary club built a school kitchen) with a Rotary Foundation Major Matching Grant. In 2005 they also began a scholarship/sponsorship program for Jr. and Sr. High School students.

In 2005, two Rotary clubs (Marina and Groveland) sponsored District Simplified Grants in their respective districts (5220 & 5230). One grant replaced the damaged water pump and electrical system for the water well at Fe Y Alegria Jr. Hi. School in Zacualpa, Guatemala. The other grant supplied the Jr. Hi. School with a computer and printer system with email connection, to facilitate the Rotary Scholarship/Sponsorship program at the school. Since then Amigos de Guatemala volunteers helped build a classroom and kitchen for a small Mayan school, finished the building at Tunaja that they built in 2005 with the addition of a cement patio, and finished a stucco type school building in Las Joyas primary school that did not have a floor, doors, windows, or electricity. The local population supplies all labor (skilled and unskilled).

Finally, during each volunteer aided building project, they distributed a large number of high quality vegetable seeds from the Seeds of Hope project for school and community gardens. The Seeds of Hope is directed by Mel Hansen of the North Stockton, CA Rotary Club.

As of April, 2006, ten clubs are part of the Amigos de Guatemala partnership. Each club contributes in accordance with its size and budget ranging from \$500 to \$2,000 annually. The partnership clubs are as follows:
