Sue McGeer – Professional Organizer, by John Freeland
Right up there with procrastination is disorganization, which is bad for business. Sue McGeer, owner of CMS Office Organizer, tells us that disorganization runs off customers, runs off high achieving employees, and runs off profits. Conversely, an organized person is more likely to impress customers, instill confidence in employees, and be more productive, increasing profits.
Being organized doesn't mean multitasking. In fact, Sue tells us, psychologists have determined multitasking garners poor results. Rather, the key to organization is prioritizing. First, you must gather incoming items, filter them and eliminate unneeded ones. Second, prioritize your tasks. This allows you to regain control. Third, you should use your time rationally. If possible, spend twenty percent of your day uninterrupted, focusing on your most important tasks. Sue says if you do this, you'll find you accomplish more things in less time.
Sue also recommends that instructions to staff be clear and specific. This reduces poor utilization of staff time. She also suggests we delegate rather than overworking ourselves. Overall, workaholics are less effective than their organized co-workers. Taking on too much causes high stress, leading to a less effective worker. Shed as many tasks to staff as you can so that you can focus on what's important. Sue makes presentations to companies and works with individuals as well. You can reach Sue at cmsdata@sbcglobal.net
